

#### Rigor


- Learning Targets must be rigorous and aligned with the standards.
- Rigor means that the targets must be at grade level and they must be complex enough for differentiation regarding grading.
- Example: I can identify the elements of science fiction and use them to draw conclusions, make predictions, and analyze the text.
- DO NOT: piece them into tiny parts or simplify them into elementary expectations (may help to know the standards for the grade below).

#### Success Criteria

Consider if your students know how and when they have met the expectations for the standards and learning targets.

Ways to provide success criteria:

- Rubrics
- Student Work Samples
- Teacher-created Examples

- Video Examples
